
Drone Event

Branches of Friendship

This 6-foot replica of an oak tree which is in the lobby has gold, silver and bronze leaves which may be engraved with your name, the name of a loved one as a memorial or as support for the library from your organization or company. The levels of giving include \$150-\$299 for a bronze leaf, \$300-\$499 for a silver leaf, \$500-\$999 for a gold leaf. \$1,000-\$4,999 for an acorn plaque, \$5,000-\$9,999 for a small boulder plaque, \$10,000-\$14,000 for a medium boulder plaque, \$15,000-\$19,999 for a large bolder plaque and for \$20,000 and above for an individual tree plaque. Forms are available at the front desk.

Book Review

THE GIRL IN THE RED COAT by Roma Ligocha

During the invasion and occupation of Poland by the Germans in WWII, a little girl was fortunate to have a strawberry red coat to keep her warm. The coat was a gift from her grandmother and as the occupation increased and became more violent, she became known as "the little girl in the red coat." She survived the war and had a very successful career in film and theater, as did her cousin, Roman Polanski. As an older adult, she was invited to the premiere of the movie Schlinder's List.

When the film began, there was only one spot of color in the black and white film and that was a little girl in a red coat. Roma at once knew this was the story of her life in Krakow during the occupation. Much of the story was correct, but the little girl in the film died. Roma decided she needed to relive that part of her life and tell her story of surviving the war including details of the horror and agony of living in communist Poland.
